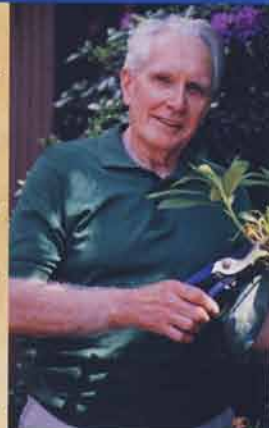

DOMINION HOTEL (DOMINION ON QUEEN)

A plaque attached to the beautiful masonry by the stone entranceway of this building tells how it began life as a brewery in 1889. Apparently the site was chosen because of proximity to local water supplies. It was established by the Davies family, and it was here that they served their award-winning ales, lagers and porters brewed in their attached breweries.

METROPOLITAN UNITED CHURCH

56 Queen Street East • 416-363-0331

The Metropolitan United Church began life in 1870 as a cathedral of Wesleyan Methodism. In 1925 it was re-organized to become the Metropolitan United Church. Although damaged by fire in 1928, its re-building incorporated most of the original walls, imposing tower, narthex and stained glass. The 23 carillon bells installed in 1923 had swelled to 54 by 1971, creating the largest set of such bells in Canada and home to one of only 11 such carillons in the country. The

largest bell weighs four and a quarter tonnes and is housed within a concrete tower seven feet thick at its base—images conjuring a medieval world. The church also has the largest organ in Canada with 8,233 pipes, the largest 32 feet high and the smallest, the size of a pencil.



QUEEN-RICHMOND CENTRE

111 Queen Street East

Verity, a private Women's Club, now occupies the building that once saw a confectioners—the old Robertson Chocolate Factory—conduct a thriving business from the year 1852. Attached to it is the George Restaurant. A library overlooks a 19th century courtyard, and computer rooms, fitness centre and spa, a nursery, meeting and hotel rooms now fill the space that once produced chocolates.

ST. PAUL'S BASILICA
83 Power Street at Queen · 416-364-7588
A large red brick, Gothic-style church rose up on Power and Queen Streets in the year 1822 in the small town of York, a building that was to become the mother church of the Archdiocese of Toronto, and the first Roman Catholic parish in Upper Canada between Kingston and Windsor. After the Diocese of Toronto separated from the diocese in Kingston in 1842, St. Paul's became the first (informal) cathedral of the new diocese under Bishop Michael Power until the completion of St. Michael's Cathedral in 1848.
In 1880, Pastor Bishop Thomas O'Mahony had the church re-built to accommodate a rapidly-growing Catholic population in the now-prospering Toronto. The new building was designed in Italian Romanesque style, patterned on the major Basilica in Rome—St. Paul's Outside the Walls—a style considered extraordinary in a city of otherwise Gothic churches. Its all-wood organ, installed in 1898, is the only one of its kind in North America.
In 1999, St. Paul's was elevated to the rank of Minor Basilica by Apostolic Decree.
